WHERE: Seattle Convention Center, Seattle, WA
WHEN: 3/11 (leaving 12:00pm) - 3/13 (leaving for home around 5pm)

Registration Deadline: **January 23**

Registration Fee: \$385 for registration (-\$35 for inducted Thespians), includes registration, hotel, meal per diem. (\$300 if you qualified with a tech Thespy 1/17) NO REFUNDS AFTER 1/23.

State Thespians Festival is coming soon. The festival will emphasize acting and directing. Workshops that will be offered include Period Acting, Acting for the Camera, Musical Theatre Solo Staging, Lighting, On site WA State Thespian Scholarship interviews, and Stage Combat.

- Friday Jan 30: Video submissions due via Google Form for overall Superior Thespys wishing to audition for State Thespy Showcase. Superiors have FOUR days (Jan 27-30) to submit their video. Recordings made live at regional Thespys are okay and encouraged!
- Wednesday Feb 4: State Thespy Showcase Participants announced.

Dear parents/guardians of Thespians,

As you may have heard from your students, there is a Washington State Thespian Festival at Seattle Convention Center in Seattle coming up very soon on the 19th through 21st of March. I would like to give you some details and phone numbers in case you need to contact your student while on this trip.

Hotel accommodations are currently being arranged...

The charter bus will be leaving the school at 8:00am. Wednesday, March 11th. We will be leaving the state festival around 5 p.m. on the 13th.

Students will provide the \$385 trip fees (\$350 if an inducted Thespian). If you qualified with your Tech Thespy at the Thespy Festival on January 17th, your fee for State is \$300. These fees cover room & breakfast, meal per diem (about \$70), and festival fees, but money for lunch and dinner may be needed to supplement that in Seattle... I recommend about \$10-15 per meal.

2026 Washington State Thespian Trip Pre-inventory & itinerary

In the following, you will be inundated with information regarding the State Festival trip. Please read this information as it pertains to you.

Room Assignments

You will be assigned to a room. If you are uncomfortable sharing a bed, talk to me and perhaps a suitable arrangement (such as the floor) can be made. I recommend bringing a pillow, double check all your toiletries-deodorant, especially!

Please meet **ON TIME** in the small parking loop to board the bus. DO NOT DAWDLE! We have very limited time and I am depending on you to be there on time or you will get last preference of room and seating on the bus. Last one to show up for check in will be our maid for the rest of the trip...bus cleaning, room service...in other words, BE ON TIME!!!!!! Bring your lunch. The first stop is Ellensburg for a rest stop. If you get food, get it to go-you are very limited on time.

Theatre Arts Contract READ THIS!!!!!!!!!!!!

Citizenship: Because our first concern is for the students' safety, education and enjoyment of the trip, we have a few guidelines to adhere to. We have a few guidelines as well as adhering to the *Student Curricular Contract*:

1. Students will not use or possess tobacco products, alcohol or illicit drugs.
2. Students will not ever be alone outside the buses or hotel. Students are required to be in groups of **three** or more.
3. No Bluetooth speakers (headphones kept to a quiet volume that cannot be heard by others is fine).
4. Students are not to display affection beyond holding hands or having arms on each other's shoulders. Brief hugs (one second or less) are fine, **no kissing!** Do not make others or me uncomfortable by your PDAs.
5. Students will not use profanity or vulgar language.
6. Students will be polite to all adults they encounter at all times. If students have a concern about a chaperone or another adult, they will see Mrs. Cooper. You will not be rude to or disobey a chaperone. They are your teacher's representatives and you will be respectful of them... even if you think they have been rude to you.
7. Males will not step foot (or any other part of their body) in hotel rooms in which females have been assigned sleeping quarters. Females will not step foot (or any other part of their body) into male sleeping rooms.
8. Please do not wear excessive perfume or cologne due the relatively small spaces on the buses and hotel rooms, and friends with breathing health issues.
9. Students will not accept rides from anyone but our bus drivers/chaperones driving their buses/vehicles.
10. Students will not fraternize with the locals nor will you tell them where we are staying!
11. Students will not phone room to room after "lights out"
12. Students will not rent movies to watch on their TV's in their rooms. Students will not open room refrigerators or touch hospitality candy or fruit in their room because you will be charged for it.
13. Students will not watch NC-17 or "R" rated movies on this trip: PERIOD!
14. Students must use common sense to be safe. If you see a potentially hazardous situation, please alert the participants.
15. You are representing Mrs. Cooper & Ferris High School. We expect nothing but the finest demeanor...make it so!
16. **ANY VIOLATION OF THESE RULES COULD RESULT IN A GREYHOUND BUS TRIP HOME EARLY...AT YOU/YOUR PARENTS' EXPENSE.**

1. Please shower and use deodorant everyday. Please bring clean garments for each day.
2. Please be prepared for personal hygiene needs and bring a toothbrush, toothpaste, and hair care items as needed (easy on the hair spray).
3. Please arrange to share hair dryers with your rooming partners.
4. Please bring clothes to sleep in (you will be sharing a queen-size bed-yes even you, boys!).
